

## ■Hot spring facilities

### [Public bath] (2nd Floor)

Weekdays: Adults ¥1,700, Children (3–12 years old) ¥900

Weekends and holidays: Adults ¥2,100, Children (3–12 years old) ¥1,100

\*Rates are for one person and include taxes, bath towel and face towel.

• Men's: Approximately 160㎡, 3 indoor baths, 2 open-air baths, 1 cold bath, and 1 sauna

• Women's: Approximately 150㎡, 3 indoor baths, 2 open-air baths, 1 cold bath, and 1 sauna

## ■[Private open-air bath]

### Okuzashiki Kaden (1st Floor)

• TYPE1 (22.0㎡): 9 rooms, accommodating up to 2 guests each

(Rates: Weekdays ¥5,500/Weekends and holidays ¥6,000)

• TYPE3 (54.0–60.0㎡): 2 rooms, accommodating up to 6 guests each

(Rates: Weekdays ¥7,500/Weekends and holidays ¥8,000)

### Hanareyuya Kaden (3rd Floor)

• TYPE2 (21.0㎡): 7 rooms, accommodating up to 2 guests each

(Rates: Weekdays ¥6,500/Weekends and holidays ¥7,000)

• TYPE3 (57.0㎡): 1 room, accommodating up to 6 guests

(Rates: Weekdays ¥7,500/Weekends and holidays ¥8,000)

Guests unable or unwilling to cover tattoos will be asked to leave.

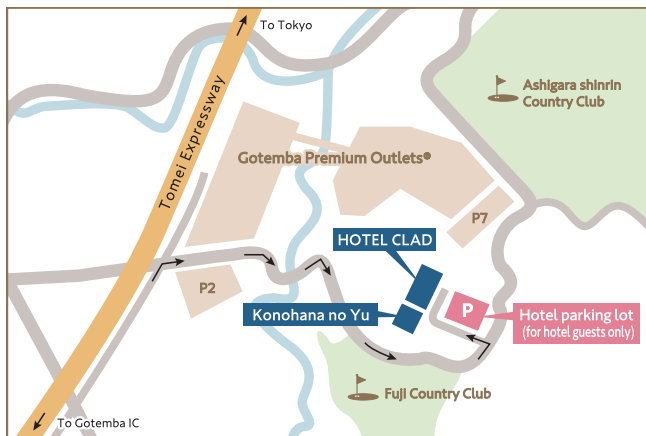
\*Guests deemed to have bothered or annoyed other guests in any way may be asked to leave.

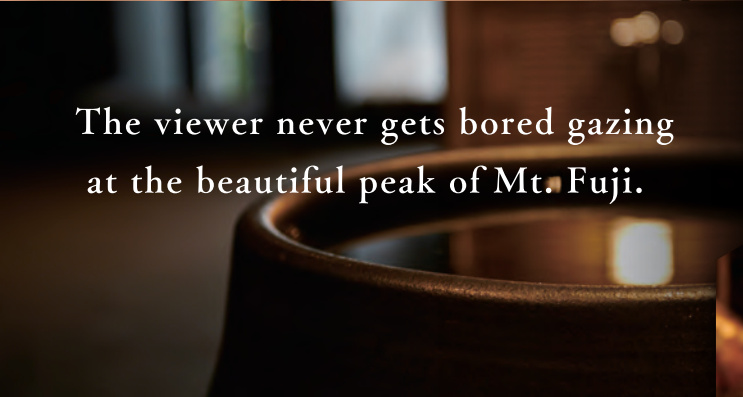

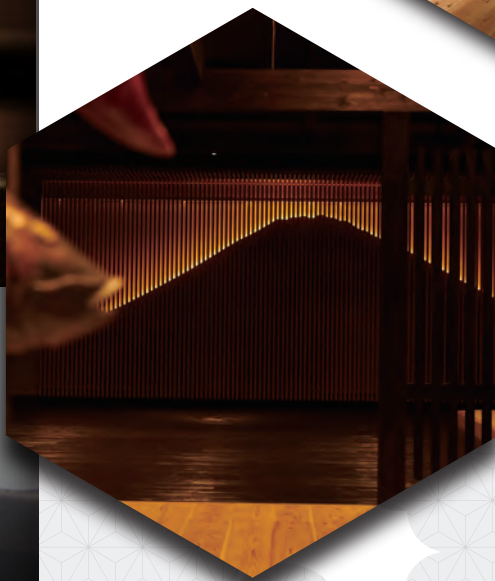
## Konohana no Yu



The viewer never gets bored gazing  
at the beautiful peak of Mt. Fuji.



The name Konohana no Yu comes from the name of the main deity of the Fujisan-hongu Sengen-taisha Shrine, which is “Konohana-no-sakuyahime-no-mikoto.” Magnificent scenery stretching back to a time before recorded history. The beautiful goddess who used water to quell an eruption of Mt. Fuji. The long-standing relationship between the people and Mt. Fuji. Konohana no Yu is home to numerous old legends relating to Mt. Fuji.





## Public bath

Take in the beauty of Mt. Fuji

The Fuji Osawa Collapse changes from day to day, in a process as natural as taking a breath.

This open-air rock bath incorporates stones taken from the nearby Fuji Osawa Collapse.

At Konohana no Yu, you get not only a fantastic view of Mt. Fuji, but also experience it directly in the rock baths.

The baths, situated at a high point, offer a spectacular straight-on view of Mt. Fuji

Approximately 21.0㎡/accommodating up to 2 guests each/7 rooms

■Rates: Weekdays ¥6,500/Weekends and holidays ¥7,000

# Dining Hanagoromo

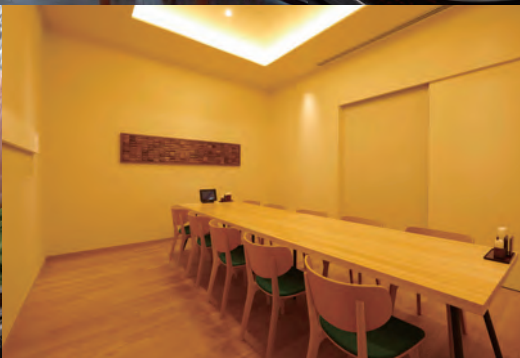
The walls of Mt. Fuji black soil are infused with Japanese washi paper.

This room is full of details reflecting the natural world including tables and other furniture that utilizes all parts of the tree including any wood waste, as well as the textures and aromas of the local area. Take in this wonderful atmosphere as you enjoy local specialties of the Gotemba region including Mikuriya soba noodles; fish and meat charcoal-grilled at the counter, and more, cooked using traditional Japanese techniques. The beautiful colors are also part of the culinary experience.

Visitors are welcome to eat at the Dining Hanagoromo, even if you aren't staying at the Hotel Clad or taking a soak in the Konohana No Yu.

## Kyusokubo resting area

This large lounge, of approximately 350m<sup>2</sup>, offers a magnificent view of Mt. Fuji from the windows. In addition to the open tatami space, there are also private spaces where you can lie down and be by yourself. This is a great way to relax after soaking in the hot spring.

This room has a collection of some 2,500 comics and various genres of books. Take a moment to relax and spend some time here.



## Konohana café

The Konohana café near the Kyusokubo relaxation room offers Mishima croquettes and Ashitaka beef cutlets, amongst other regional cheap-and-delicious food of Shizuoka Prefecture. Draft beer, craft beer, soft drinks, bar snacks, and soft-serve ice cream are also available.

## Relaxation Yumegatari

Choose from a wide variety of relaxation options including vertical pressure massage, Japanese-style massage, traditional Thai massage, and more. Make a reservation at the 2nd Floor Lobby Reception Desk, and then relax in a semi-private room where you get your treatment along with a soak in the hot spring. Guests may also choose a body oil detox massage, done in a private room.
